Sculpture Guidelines



Where? Washington County Extension Office 2536 North McConnell Avenue Fayetteville, Arkansas What Division?

Individual Adult: 20 and up Youth: age 9-19 Tots: age 5-8



<u>Group</u> Youth: age 5-19 (ex. Scouts, 4-H, classroom) Mixed age: Adult & Youth/Tot (ex. Grandma helping kids)

- Sculptures can be built and entered as a group or individual. If you have a group entry, you can also enter another sculpture in the individual division.
- Assembled with littered materials that have been picked up in the community. These items CANNOT be natural materials like sticks, leaves, or rocks.
- A variety of different types of litter is recommended.
- FOUR items from household recycling bins can be included in your sculpture.
- Any type of glue adhesive, wire, screws, or nails can be used.
- Sculpture can be painted.
- Sculpture must be able to transfer locations without falling apart.
- Sculpture should not be larger than: length 24 in. x width 18 in. x height 24 in. and not more than 20 lbs.

Entering Item

- Register by contacting lsimpson@uaex.edu or (479) 271-1060 by noon on Friday August 21, 2020. There is no entry fee.
- Enter sculpture on August 22, 2020 11:00 am -2:00 pm.
- Provide the name(s) and age(s) of each person, and the date(s) and town(s) of where litter was picked up.
- New this year title the sculpture and write a paragraph about your creation.

Judging

- August 25th-29th the sculptures will be voted on by the public during the fair. Crowd favorites in the five divisions will receive awards the following week.
- Winners in each division will receive \$50.00 gift card sponsored by Boston Mountain Solid Waste District.
- Second place in each division will receive \$25.00 gift card to Lewis & Clark.
- Third place in each division will receive a canvas utility bag.

Sponsors will use winning sculptures for educational purposes.
